#### FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S OFFICE

New Years is an exciting time of the year where we all reflect on the past year and anticipate the year to come. It's a time of year for celebration and making New Year's resolutions. Hope is alive and everything seems possible. It is my intention to use this letter to reflect on this past year and then outline my hopes for 2020.

2019 was a great year here at the "FORT"! The District Test Scores continued to improve and finished in the top 12% of the State. NICHE and National School Ranking company ranked the Fort Calhoun Community Schools 13th in the State of Nebraska. The District saw a growth in the student population and a lot of great community support. Our student-athletes also had a great year representing our community at some of the highest levels. The Marching Band received a superior at the State Band Marching contest and other clubs and activities also had good years.

The District has continued the process of committing to a 3 classroom per grade level strategy and has committed to a 4-classroom addition that will break ground in March. The strategy the Board adopted several years ago to increase revenue by leveraging student growth dollars through the Option Enrollment plan is working well. As Option openings have decreased we have seen an increase in families moving to our District. The increase in State Aid has allowed us to improve and expand facilities which in-turn has attracted more families to move into our school district.

2020 holds a ton of promise for our school district. The District will be building once again with the fourroom addition that is scheduled to be completed prior to the start of the 2020-2021 school year. The Board and administration will have to plan for the remaining phases of the building process to complete long range plans. This last phase will have to address the recreation space and the Pre-school/Early Childhood program.

Last but certainly not least the Board of Education will pick my successor, as I will complete my career here on June 30th of 2020. My career has been a blessing to my family and me and it is my hope that the community will support the Superintendent in the same fashion they have supported me over the past 10 years. It is my hope and prayer that the Fort Calhoun Community Schools will thrive on for years to come and continue to be a leader in the education of Nebraska schools.

I hope everyone has had a great winter break! It is a great time to be surrounded by your family and friends as you celebrate the holidays and the start of a new year. I know for myself, it is always an opportunity to relax and recharge as I get ready for the second half of the school year. I am excited to get students back in the building and get back into the swing of it!

I want to take a moment to recognize what we have been doing with our new weight lifting program and all of the work our coaches are doing. Coach Christensen came to me about a year ago and proposed a weight lifting program that would be available to all our athletes year round. Dr. Johnson and the administration were very supportive of this program from the beginning to help get it off and running.

We currently offer lifting three days a week, Monday-Wednesday-Friday, in the morning. It is open to all athletes both male and female. We have been averaging over 75 athletes each day! If you look at our athletes, you can see the physical difference it is making. They are truly becoming bigger, faster, and stronger. We are also starting to see that work pay off on the athletic playing field. Our athletes are jumping higher and are physically stronger.

This program has already started to make an impact and will have a long lasting affect on our athletes in years to come. As we train more athletes we are looking for it to translate into more victories in sports. Coach Christensen also reminds me constantly that not only are we improving our athletes; we are equipping them with skills that they can use the rest of their lives to stay physically fit. I want to thank all of our coaches who are up in the weight room with our athletes on a regular basis with a special shout out to Coach Christensen, Coach Humphrey, and Coach Thomas. Thanks for all that you do working with our athletes every day!

## Elementary News Your Principal: Drew R. Wagner Engaging + Learning + Achieving = Productive PIONEERS!

Hello from the elementary! As we close out the first part of the school year, I think about students being safe and did we provide them different opportunities to flourish. We entered this month with a plethora of activities from November. A few activities this month included mid-year testing, 6th Grade Career Readiness day, Health rescreens, Classroom celebrations, and much more. As we look toward 2020 I wanted to take some time to elaborate on our goals for this year. Here we go!

The first goal is to deploy and initiate a movement called Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports. I hope you have heard some buzz from your student on this initiative. Here are a few indicators that you may have heard about with PBIS. If you have heard about the "tickets" then you can answer yes. If you have heard about "Pioneer of the Day/Week" then you can answer yes. The school has been sending home information with updates on this process. Remember this program is designed to assist with our behavior goals by recognizing positive behavior with an incorporation of our behavior flowchart. The school is tracking this process through our committee meetings which are happening on a monthly basis. During these meetings we have an action plan that we have been following to ensure we are staying on the right track. We are taking this process at a slow and steady pace and are looking forward to the evolution of this program for the future. We are excited to have the students go through another round of "Expectation Stations" in January. This will be a nice reminder for students as we head into the second part of the school year. Please continue to ask your students about this movement. We are super excited to reinforce positive behavior and keep students safe! Remember our four behavior goals are: Safe, Brave, Respectful and Responsible.

Next, this goal was based on of results/feedback from all with emphasis on English Language Arts. Our main goal was to improve students' growth by 10% based on a variety of assessments. At this time our students are on the right track. We are constantly looking at the data from assessments (E.g. NWEA, Dibels) to daily running records to track this progress. We also have a great partnership with our Educational Service Unit assisting us track this progress. Lastly, the tracking of this goal takes a lot of time and effort with the collaboration of the professionals. In that collaboration staff is having those specific conversations attending to those needs for each student. This is a big goal. This goal will continue into next school year based on of our results. Of course staff are receiving opportunities to further gain knowledge to assist students to make those appropriate gains. I can't wait to see the next round of results.

In conclusion, this next part of the school year will go by fast. Please take time to enjoy your experience here. We continue to be a school that thrives to be excellent every year. We do this by building relationships, collaboration, communication, continual growth and of course with a positive outlook. Combine this with our District mission and it is evident we are laser focused to do what is best for students. Thank you for choosing Fort Calhoun. It is a great day to be a PIONEER! Go TEAM!
