

Preventative action is always in the best interest of our school district and for our kids. This past month we ran the reunification drill at the elementary, last spring we ran the reunification drill at the high school; both drills went well and gave us insight to how to better prepare and safeguard students in any situation which may confront us. Our School District adopted the ALICE training method for student safety when it comes to the possibility of an Active Shooter. The first steps in the process were training our staff in the practice, the second step has been developing and conducting reunification drills. After completing these steps our next steps will be to educate students and at both the elementary and the high school. Following that, or during that process, we will communicate the expectations to the parents regarding their role in this process. Stay Tuned!

At the end of the day we have put together a safety calendar and are working to complete a comprehensive safety program that will keep your students safe to the best of our abilities.

PowerSchool has been a resource that we have made accessible to parents and students for several years now and we want to make sure that you are using it to its full potential. Some of the things that PowerSchool allows you to do: check current grades, check attendance, check lunch money balance, and also receive notifications.

As the AD, the academically ineligible list for failing 2 or more grades is something that I follow very closely. It is a hard part of the job as a coach or teacher to tell kids that they are not able to play their games due to grades, but we all understand the importance of holding students accountable. I have had numerous conversations with students over the past 2 weeks on how to check PowerSchool so that they could monitor their grades. I encourage all students and parents to get on PowerSchool at minimum once a week and check their grades. If do not know how to get onto PowerSchool, please contact the office and we will help point you in the right direction.
