

It is hard to believe we are already more than three weeks into the school year. Teachers, students, and staff are off to a great start and are working hard. There is a lot of planning and preparation that goes into the start of a school year. Many people are hard at work so when the students walk in the doors everything is ready to go. The maintenance and grounds crew have spent a lot of time getting the outside looking sharp, by the way that is one person, we are looking to hire a grounds person if you know anyone interested. The custodial crew has the inside of the building ready and have worked with the teachers to get the right number of desks, tables and chairs and other furniture and equipment ready. As we move through fall activities, I want to give everyone a reminder that winter sports are right around the corner. Please know we are dependent upon the NSAA, Three Rivers Health Department, and the NDE to establish our winter plans. Information continues to come and change, and we will communicate through the fall and winter seasons. Our coaches are going above and beyond to provide a safe environment for our students in the weight room, skill development, practices, and games.

Winter Physical Form Information: I want to remind parents of students who plan to participate in athletics this winter in grades 7-12 need to submit their physical to the main HS office. The sports physical must take place after May 1, 2021 to qualify them for the 2021-2022 school year. The specific line we are looking for is "the athlete is cleared without restrictions to participate in athletics." Any student that has a 2021 fall Sports Physical does not need a new physical form for winter activities.

We have completed our third full week of school already, where does the time go? It has been awesome to see our students here working hard everyday. As we enter the month of September we have seen grades hitting the grade book, NWEA testing come and pass, and HS and JRH sports seasons in full swing. In the next few paragraphs, I highlighted a few things I think everyone should be aware of.

Academic eligibility begins Tuesday, September 7th. Any student failing one or more classes will be ineligible to compete in any school-sponsored activity. Students who are ineligible are still expected to attend practices and games. If they participate in an activity that would leave school before the end of the school day, they are not allowed to miss school time when academically ineligible and would not be able to travel with the team. As soon as their grades are all back to passing, they are immediately eligible to participate in competitions.

The HELP process for students who are missing homework is in place again this year. For grades 7-8, that will be on Fridays from 1:30-2:30. For grades 9-12, that will be after school until 4:15 Monday - Thursday. HELP is designed to assist your child academically by giving them time to complete missing homework. Our goal is for students to have all homework completed which increases their probability of passing their classes.

Homecoming week will be here soon. Homecoming is the week of September 20th. The homecoming parade and pep rally are currently scheduled for Friday, September 24th. The parade will take place down 15th street as it has in the past beginning at 12:30 pm. The homecoming pep rally will be at the football field immediately after the parade. The homecoming dance will be held on Saturday, September 25th at the HS. Information regarding the dance will be shared with students as we near that date.

Nondiscrimination Policy 3053

The School District does not discriminate on the basis of prohibited factors in employment and educational programs/activities. The School District affirmatively strives to provide equal opportunity for allas required by:

- -Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 -prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, or national origin
- -Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 as amended -prohibits discrimination in employment on the basis of race, color, religion, gender, or national origin
- -Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 -prohibits discrimination on the basis of gender
- -Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 1967 (ADEA) as amended -prohibits discrimination on the basis of age with respect to individuals who are at least 40
- -The Equal Pay Act of 1963 as amended -prohibits gender discrimination in payment of wages to women and men performing substantially equal work in the same establishment
- -Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 -prohibits discrimination against the disabled
- -Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) -prohibits discrimination against individuals with disabilities in employ ment, public service, public accommodations and telecommunications
- -The Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993 (FMLA) -requires covered employers to provide up to 12 weeks of unpaid, job-protected leave to "eligible" employees for certain family and medical reasons
- -The Pregnancy Discrimination Act of 1978 -prohibits discriminationin employment on the basis of pregnancy, childbirth, or related medical conditions
- -The Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA) –provides job protections and reem ployment rights to military reservists and National Guard memberscalled to active duty
- -The Nebraska Fair Employment Practice Act (FEPA) –prohibits employment discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex (including pregnancy), disability, marital status, and retaliation
- -Nebraska Age Discrimination in Employment Act (Age Act) –prohibits employment discrimination on the basis of age for those individuals who are over 40 years of age
- -The Equal Pay Act of Nebraska -prohibits discriminatory wage practices based on sex
- -The Nebraska Equal Opportunity in Education Act –prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex (including preg nancy) by any educational institution
- -Veterans Preference Law (NEB.REV.STAT§§ 48-225 to 48-231) -stipulates categorical preferences for employment for military veterans and for the spouses of disabled veterans

Additional School Board policies prohibit harassment and/or discrimination against students, employees, or patrons on the basis of sex, race, color, ethnic or national origin, religion, marital status, disability, age, pregnancy, and any other legally prohibited basis. Retaliation for engaging in a protected activity is also prohibited.

Any person who believes she or he has been discriminated against, denied a benefit, or excluded from participation inany district education program or activity may file a complaintusing the district's complaintsprocedures.

Inquiries regarding compliance with any of the laws referred to in this policy may be directed to the superintendent or to the district's Title IX and/or Section 504/ADA Coordinator.
