Lunch Program Information

School districts have been notified that the USDA does not have the authority to extend waivers that allow nocost meals to all students. In light of this, Fort Calhoun students will pay for school meals. To alleviate some of the financial hardship this may cause, a waiver was put in place that allows schools to use the benefits that were on file from the 2019-20 school year to grant a 30 day carryover of the benefits from that time. This will allow families extra time to file meal applications for 2022-23. Thank you!

Parents/Guardians/Visitors in the building

As we evaluated this topic for the 2022-23 school year the main focus we considered was safety and sanitation. After much discussion, we have decided to open the building back up to parents/guardians/visitors at a limited capacity. Parents/guardians/visitors may volunteer in the classroom setting with proper approval and proper documents with background checks filled out appropriately. We are not allowing parents/guardians/ visitors to eat in the lunchroom. This task of attempting to monitor the foot traffic during the school day is very purposeful to limit unknown visits. We truly appreciate your support with this decision. We will re-evaluate this process each year. Thank you!

Handbook Updates

At this time we would like to update you on any changes/ updates to the elementary handbook that you should be aware of. Please remember the Parent/Student Handbook is intended to provide communication guidelines for a transparent process and of course keeping our environment safe for all.

*Pg. 7. Attendance. The change here was consolidating all topics relating to attendance (Ex. Absences, attendance policy, tardiness) under one heading.

*Pg. 18. Behavior Goals. The change here was updating these goals to our current PBIS behavior goals.

*Pg. 25. Daily schedule. The change here was updating the daily schedule to match the changes to the master schedule.

*Pg. 49. Visitors. The change here was updating the process to volunteer in the school. Proper background paperwork needs to be filled out before volunteering at the school.

Preschool Program Information

The first day of preschool will be Monday, August 15. Morning preschool class is from 8:00-11:15am and afternoon preschool class is from 11:50-3:05pm. Before school begins, you will need to bring a copy of your child's birth certificate and current immunization records. The first tuition payment is due on or before August 1st. Tuition payments are due on the 20th of each month beginning in September. The monthly tuition rate at this time is \$140. We look forward to seeing you soon. Thank you for choosing us!

*Preschool families.

*K-2nd Grade. The pick-up/drop-off will be the same as the following years. If you prefer to have your older child (3rd-6th grade) come upstair to get picked up in the K-2nd pick up lane please contact the office and classroom teacher. Thank you!

*3rd-6th Grade. Pick-up/drop-off. Please utilize Adams Street ONLY! This traffic should not interfere with the bus lane. Cars may queue behind the bus lane for pick up. Once the buses have left the bus lane the traffic may flow forward to pick-up your student. Mrs. Hodson's class and Mrs. Szlachetka's class may be picked up in the upstairs drop-off and pick-up lane.
