

OPTION ENROLLMENT 2026-27

The Option Enrollment application period for the 2026-27 school year opens on September 1, 2025 and runs through March 15, 2026. Forms are available on our website or at the school offices. Applicants are taken on a first-come, first-serve basis within the guidelines set by our Board of Education and according to State law. All applicants must be notified one way or the other by April 1st.

These relationships also contribute to students' long-term social and emotional development, helping them build confidence, resilience, and interpersonal skills.

Nurturing positive staff-student relationships is not just beneficial—it is essential. It creates a culture of respect and support that empowers students to reach their full potential both inside and outside the classroom, enhancing the overall learning experience.

I would like to share a few reminders to help avoid confusion at some of our facilities/home events:

Football Field & Track: Hopefully, you've noticed the new visitor bleachers on the east side of the track! This section is reserved for visiting teams only. We ask that spectators not stand on the track during home football games.

Track Usage: When the football field and track are not in use for school activities, the community is welcome to use the track for recreational purposes. However, no practices or games are allowed unless permission is granted by the administration. Also, no bikes, strollers, rollerblades, etc., are permitted on the track.

Fort Calhoun Facility Pet Policy: You may have seen new yellow signs at the football/track facility gate. As a reminder, pets are not allowed at any Fort Calhoun Community Schools event—indoors or outdoors—at any building. The only exception is for service animals approved by Fort Calhoun administration, in accordance with school board policy.

New Emergency Access Road - Wrestling Room: We've added an emergency access road to the wrestling room for EMS use only. This is not a parking lot. Unauthorized vehicles may be towed at the discretion of FCCS or the homeowner.

Cross Country Events at Fort Atkinson: We love seeing your support at our home cross country meets! Just a reminder, anyone entering the park (even on foot) must have a valid Nebraska Parks Pass. Fort Calhoun Activity Passes and NCC Passes will not be accepted. Park passes can be purchased ahead of time on https://www.gooutdoorsne.com/customer/ catalog

Finally, looking ahead, the winter sports season is just around the corner! As a reminder, any student in grades 7–12 who wishes to participate in activities must have a current sports physical on file and a signed NSAA consent form (located in the high school office) submitted to the office before they will be allowed to participate.
