5002.2 Resident Students

Students who are residents of the school district will attend the district without paying tuition. The residence of a student means the place, abode, or dwelling of the student.

Any student shall be admitted to the district upon the request without paying tuition if at the student or least one of the student's parents resides in the school district.

Students whose residency in the district ceases during a school year may continue attending school for the remainder of the school year.

The Superintendent will decide each case involving the determination of residence of a student upon its individual merits. The burden of proof to supply the necessary documents to demonstrate legal residence shall rest with the person claiming legal residence in the district. Specific documents required are noted in the addendum entitled: Proof of Residency – A and/or Proof of Residency - B.

Improper Enrollment:

If a student is improperly enrolled in the District, the District in its sole discretion may

- 1. Exclude the student from the schools of the District: or
- 2. Permit the nonresident student to remain enrolled in the district as a nonresident student provided the student files appropriate option paperwork or other legal documents entitling him/her to attend the district.
