Navigating Our Website—A Crash Course

The tabs described here are on our homepage www.fortcalhounschools.org.

The "Directory" tab has all staff, alphabetically with pictures, their assignments and a link to e-mail them.

The "Calendars" tab has a drop down menu and the first entry is the 17-18 District Calendar which was approved by the Board of Education for general information about the days school is in session for students and staff, including holidays, conferences, early outs etc. The second tab, "16-17", is last year's District Calendar which may be used for reference. The third tab is the "Community Building Calendar" where you may go to find activities happening in the buildings or to sign up for use. There are also tabs for a "Printable Lunch Calendar" and "Sports Schedules". Possibly the most important information is listed under the "Full Calendar View" tab. It lists information about all activities, sports, lunches, and school happenings scheduled so far and any changes that may have been made to information already published. You may view the information either by day, week, month, year, activity, sport and the list goes on! It is also printable so you can have a copy to hang on your fridge. Sports, Clubs and Activities, and Performing Arts are all found under "Pioneer Pride" just under the big Pioneer. Please note - all information is subject to change if circumstances change.

Some class and curriculum information is available under the "Moodle" tab however, it is in a transitional stage working toward moving to Google Classroom for 2018-19. There is information available on the Google Classroom app accessible on student iPads by them logging in for you.

FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S OFFICE

Off and Running!

The 2017-18 school year is running on all cylinders. High School classes and activities are in full gear. Elementary classes are up and running but we are still in the process of finishing the kitchen and cafeteria remodel. I appreciate the staff for their ability to keep classes up and running while construction is drawing to a close. The elementary students are getting fed and are enjoying the additional room in the cafeteria. The rest of the project including the elevator addition should be completed at the end of this month.

School is off to a great start. There are a lot of new faces in our hallways including a few new staff members and a lot of new kids. Our hallways are full and students are settling into the school routine. As has been our practice over the past several years, every summer the Board of Education works to create annual goals to improve the education we provide for the students here at the "FORT". The 2017-18 board goals are:

- 1. The Board of Education will work to complete all current projects at all building sites in the School District
- 2. The Board of Education will complete a comprehensive school safety program and communicate it to all stakeholders in the School District.

In the District offices we are putting the finishing touches on the 2017-18 budget. This year's budget has been especially difficult as we took a \$500,000 drop in State Aid. That drop plus finishing the Kitchen/Cafeteria project to correct code violations as well as space issues at the elementary will make this a really tight fiscal year. The saving grace this year is the increase in enrollment has offset some of the losses we have incurred due to the shortfall in State Aid. Balancing student growth with rising costs and keeping our District viable is a constant battle. You can be assured that the District offices and the Board of Education are constantly analyzing these issues and continue to work to put our District in the best position to educate our students at the highest levels while trying to do this as economically as we can. The building improvements program that we instigated seven years ago is almost complete. The remodeled buildings as well as the additional square footage have put our District in a great place to attract more families to the Fort Calhoun area. Once again thanks for your support in these efforts; it is because of this support that our buildings are equipped to educate students at the "FORT" for years to come.

The Fort Calhoun community is a great place to raise and educate children thanks to your support and to a great staff!


