Reading

The first graders have dove into our first unit in reading! The students have learned the short a, short I, and l-blend sounds. They have been doing a great job reading and finding the key details in their stories.

<u>Grammar</u>

The students have been practicing writing sentences. We make sure to have a capital letter, punctuation mark, and a whole idea every time we write. We are beginning to talk about different kinds of sentences. The students will practice writing statements, questions, and exclamatory sentences.

<u>Math</u>

The first graders have been digging into addition and subtraction. They have been using different strategies like counting on, counting back, using a number line, doubles, and making a ten to find the sum and difference. We have also been learning how addition and subtraction are related. **Science**

The first graders have been learning all about sound. We are learning how to describe the different sounds that we hear everyday. We will discover why certain things make the sounds that they do. Lastly, we will explore the many uses of sound and why it is so important!. **Social Studies**

The students have been learning about families and community. We have talked about events that can bring families and a community together.

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4th grade - Mrs. Omer, Mrs. Schleifer & Mrs. Beacom

August and September have been busy days full of new adventures in fourth grade! Students are adjusting well to the classroom routines, procedures, and are working to do their best. Language Arts is an adventure of investigating our Reading Wonders series through technology. Already we have studied 5 genres: Fairy Tales, Realistic Fiction, Expository Text, Narrative Nonfiction and Persuasive Text. Our marvelous mathematicians are passing timed tests, mastering place value, rounding, comparing and writing numbers in different forms. The students are learning new problem solving techniques, plus reviewing long addition and subtraction skills. We just began our adventure into multiplication! In science, we are investigating how motion and energy are related. We are going to put our knowledge to the test and create a safety feature for a car. During Social Studies, our student explorers have had an overview of how the wonderful nation we live in was born. Stay tuned for more exciting adventures of the fabulous fourth grade Pioneers!

5th grade - Ms. Carlson & Mrs. Romans

We've had a great start to fifth grade! We are working hard! In math we began with reviewing place value and learning strategies to correctly add and subtract decimals. Now we're working, in depth, on multiplication (including multiplying multiple digits and multiplying decimals). It's so important to get those basic facts memorized!

In language arts we have been studying different types of sentences, compound subjects and predicates, and how to combine phrases using conjunctions. We've read and discussed biographies, narrative nonfiction, and realistic fiction. Next we'll study persuasive articles and persuasive writing.

In Social Studies, we have completed our unit on Native American history. We are now beginning to learn about the discovery and exploration of America.

In Science, we have been learning about the properties of matter and how matter changes both physically and chemically. Soon we will be experts on the conservation of matter! NWEA and DIBELS testing are wrapped up. Fifth graders are diving into SeeSaw, a digital platform portfolio for students to share their work with their parents, teachers, and each other. We are excited to share even more information at our upcoming fall conferences. Ms. Carlson & Mrs. Romans

<u>6th grade - Mrs. Larsen, Mr. Mallette & Mr. Teeter</u>

October is starting out busy and promises to stay that way! We start out with 6th Grade Conservation Day and then it will be time to prepare for our first Student-Led Conferences!

ELA: We are reaching the end of Unit One of Reading Wonders. We've been working to improve our comprehension using strategies (reread, visualize) and skills (main idea/detail, story elements) while reading fiction and expository texts. Our vocabulary work has involved creating Digital Dictionaries in Google Classroom.

Math is headed into integers and rational numbers. Remind your students about getting Pearson quizzes prechecked and asking questions on things they are not certain of.

Science has wrapped up our first unit dealing with the Scientific Method. We are currently learning about the basics of "Living Things in the Biosphere." Please reach out to your child about what is going on in science. There are enrichment activities and videos online on Pearson for extracurricular learning. If there are struggles with understanding a concept please have your child or yourself email me.

CSD: Computer Science Discoveries (CSD) is an introductory computer science course that empowers students to create authentic artifacts and engage with computer science as a medium for creativity, communication, problem-solving, and fun. This class is taught by Mr. Mike Mallette and the HAL teacher, Mr. PJ Mallette, every Friday. We are wrapping up our first problem-solving project, PBIS instructional videos.

Career Day: We have 6 speakers coming in on Oct. 4 to discuss their chosen career. We will be doing this a couple of additional times throughout the school year. These days make great conversation starters for discussions with your student about what their vision of the future is.

Conservation Day Field Trip: We will be traveling to Summit Lake on Oct. 3 for our first field trip. The activities involved for this trip include hiking, identifying living organisms, and learning about how we can conserve the world around us. The students will need to have a cold lunch this day (there will be NO microwaves for heating up food). Please be alert for how the weather is going to be this day to allow for proper planning of what your child should wear that day, closed-toed shoes that you don't mind getting dirty would be advised (tennis shoes or hiking boots for example).
